# Class News

# **Rabbits**

We made it! Well done Rabbit Class, for a wonderful first term! We are almost at the end of our level 2 phonics, so many new sounds! We have one more week of level 2 when we return from half term and then will work on consolidating these.. In maths, we have been looking at different ways to represent 1,2 and 3, which the children have really enjoyed. Mrs Shearer worked with Rabbit Class on autumn silhouette paintings, which turned out beautifully. As the weather has taken a turn and our outside area has been incredibly wet, we took the opportunity to turn it into a muddy car track with a car wash! This was a massive hit and thoroughly enjoyed! Have a lovely rest over half term!

# **Hedgehogs**

WOW! What a 'Fabulous Finish' to the end of our first term this year! We have worked so hard in all of our learning, but especially in English. We have now finished our beautiful Monkey Puzzle stories. We have all written our best writing, copying up our edited work. We have created illustrations, as well as a front and a back cover including a 'blurb'. We have shared these stories with each other and they are now hanging up in the classroom for the children to read whenever they want. We already have some budding authors and illustrators in Hedgehog Class! In maths we have continued our learning about addition and subtraction. This week we have concentrated on finding the difference and fact families - using the same family of numbers to create addition and subtraction equations. In Art we created some beautiful pieces, based on a scene. We created landscapes with an object, using charcoal, graded pencils and graphite pencils - some of these are now displayed in the hall. Hedgehog Class have worked so very hard in all their learning this term. I am so proud of them all. Have a lovely Half  $_{

### Foxes

I am so impressed by the amount of incredible work and effort that foxes have put in this term. This week we completed our own stories of the 'Wild Robot' which have been so lovely to read, they are all so different and unique! In maths we have been doing times table practice for the three's and comparing subtraction and addition with column method. In French we have learnt how to ask each other's age and how to respond. In music foxes used percussion instruments with Mrs Bartholomew to a short clip from 'Iron Man' adaptation from the book written by Ted Hughes. In computing we have continued to focus on emails and wrote a class email to the lovely

Mrs Shearer. Have an incredible half term!!!

# **Badgers**

What an incredibly busy term it has been! This week, we looked at, planned and wrote formal letters, making sure we used formal language and the correct layout. In maths, we have really tested our brains, learning how to use column multiplication to multiply up to 4-digit by 2-digit numbers. In RE, we reflected on our big question for the term and wrote our final answers. In PSHE, we learnt about how discrimination can affect different groups, and reminded ourselves of the story of Rosa Parks and how she helped to change civil rights in the USA. We finished our incredible Anderson Shelters, decorating and painting so they look ready for an air raid! The children worked really hard to overcome difficulties with shaping materials, and they look absolutely fantastic. In music, we learnt how to

sing 'It's a Long Way to Tipperary' in a round, with a bystander remarking that they sounded like 'angels'!


