Class News

Rabbits

What a super icy cool week we have had in Rabbit Class! We have been learning all about the season winter and enjoying exploring ice! We predicted what might happen if we put water in the freezer and then had an exciting time Friday afternoon playing with the ice we had made! Rabbit class have produced some excellent writing in literacy, all about winter, using their phonics knowledge. In phonics, we have been consolidating our level 2 sounds but will be moving on to level 3 phonics on Monday! In maths, we have been learning about the composition of numbers 4 and 5 and starting to learn our number bonds. It was also very exciting on Friday to have our first rehearsal for our wonderful Nativity performance at the church! Have a restful weekend!

<u>Hedgehogs</u>

Another full-on week of learning in Hedgehog Class. In English we have begun our new text of 'Beegu' by Alexis Deacon. It is a beautiful book about a lost creature. We have written about his character in terms of his emotions and begun to learn how to use 'contractions' in our learning. In Maths we have been enjoying learning about the properties of 2D and 3D shape. We have also recruited two new TA's in my class - RG and JG from Year 2 - who spent time teaching GV (in Year 1) about 3D shapes and their properties when he returned after being poorly. We also found out how to use a ruler to make our shapes accurately. In Art we have been learning how to paint landscapes like the artist Eric Ravillious, a local artist from Sussex born in 1903, who created paintings based on local landscapes of Sussex. We used watercolours to create texture and tone. In Science we are watching a garlic bulb - an investigation to see how roots and shoots will grow on a bulb. We also planted daffodils in our front space, learning how to do this by following instructions carefully. Our Nativity is going well - we have even begun saying our lines without a script this week! Look out for costume letters which will be coming out in bags today!

Foxes

This week Foxes have been enjoying English as it is all about Horrible Histories. We are working on producing a non-chronological report in a horrible histories style which includes jokes, puns, and interesting facts. In maths we have been focusing on times tables, particularly 4's, 8's and 3's. In science we had an interesting investigation, where we made tin foil sculptures and measured their shadows. We discussed how the tin foil was an 'opaque' object. In PE we have been creating lovely group performances in gymnastics, using different speeds. In RE we learnt all about what happens at a Baptism and the stages of it. In computing, we worked in pairs to program two animated names. We had a FANASTIC time at forest school, we got to go on the slack line, the hammock, create dens, create woodland leaf crowns and we even got to make bird feeders. Have a lovely weekend.

<u>Badgers</u>

Badgers just keep smashing it out of the park! In maths, we have continued with fractions, converting, comparing and ordering. In English, we have planned our own endings to Rose Blanche and began thinking about 'show not tell' writing to improve our descriptions. In science, we completed our shadow experiment, measuring a member of our group's shadow on the playground every hour to see how it changed. We also began learning about specular reflection, and will complete an experiment to explore this next week. In art, we experimented with monotype printing, drawing on top of paper resting on ink to see what patterns we'd create. In RE, we read the Parable of the Tenants and produced a piece of artwork to reflect it. In French, learnt instructions and tried to respond in the correct way to them. In Geography, the children used laptops to research the climate of a European City. In computing, we learnt about the Mars Rover, and used our computers to calculate the distance between Earth and Mars measured in buildings, sharks and other random objects! We also began learning about binary code, playing a great game to work on our understanding. 3
