Class News

Rabbits

Well done, Rabbits, on a great first week back. We have had a wonderful week learning all about Bonfire Night and why we celebrate it. This week, we have finished our level 2 phonics sounds! To make sure we are secure in level 2 sounds, we will be continuing to recap these for the next two weeks, before moving on to level 3. In maths, we have been looking at the composition of numbers and how they can be made up in different ways. We enjoyed our very own firework display in the classroom and even made glittery firework paintings. As well as our normal PE session this week, we also were lucky enough to have a lesson with Uckfield College students, which the children really enjoyed! Hope you have a lovely weekend!

<u>Hedgehogs</u>

Welcome back! We are so excited to be back in Term 2! Ready to explore 'What happens if my environment changes?' as our learning question. In English we have begun learning through our new book 'Here We Are' by Oliver Jeffers. The book talks about our Earth and everything in it. We have described elements of the book, acted out parts of the book by explaining the land, sea, people and animals to others. We have also created some beautiful drawings representing the theme of the book. In Maths we have been learning about bigger numbers – up to one hundred! We have been writing them in digits and in words, as well as partitioning and making numbers using tens and ones. In Science we have begun learning about 'Plants' – exploring how to group seeds, noticing their differing properties.

We had a lot of fun with Mrs Hanham and the students from Uckfield College who came to teach us lots of new skills with balls, quoits, balloons and scoring with targets. The most exciting part has been discussing our new Nativity for this year! We can't wait!

Foxes

What a fab first week back! In English we have started our new book 'The Boy and the Globe' which is set in Tudor times. So far, we have made character profiles, explored prepositions, and described a route through London using prepositions. In maths we have been doing lots of subtraction and challenges, everyone has been working hard with the exchanging. In science we have started to learn about light, we organised different natural and artificial light sources into categories. In History we learnt about the battle of Bosworth and had great fun making freeze frames and comic strips about this. In art we have started to work on our shading skills, we practiced different ways and methods of shading. In French we did classroom instructions and in music we got to listen to Tudor music. It has been an exciting week and I am looking forward to more this term! Have a lovely weekend. ©

Badgers

It has been an incredibly busy first week back! The children have smashed maths this week, recapping short division and moving onto long division, some with remainders! We have begun looking at WW2 poetry in English, learning the features of a sonnet. After planning, we have begun drafting our own sonnets based around WW2. In Art, we recapped our different drawing techniques, which helped us a lot when creating observational drawings from a range of collage work. We are excited to make our first collage next week. We finished off two science experiments from last term, testing how surface area changes the effect water resistance has on an object, and exploring how friction can change the newtons needed to move an object across a surface. In PE, the children began learning their roundoff techniques with Miss Dorsett – it was very interesting to watch through the window! Have a lovely weekend, and I'm sure I'll see many of you at the Airman's Grave.




