
Rabbit Newsletter Term 1 2025


Dear Rabbit Families,

We wish all of you a warm welcome to Rabbit Class! Our topic for the first term is 'Here I am!'. We will be reading a range of texts such as The Little Red Hen, A Place Called Home, Super Duper You, From Head to Toe and The Big Book of Belonging.











We will be exploring who we are as people and our place in the world, including where we live and who we live with. We will also be learning about our immediate environment, embarking on a tour of our new school and the grounds. Alongside this, we will be working on counting, number recognition, sizing and comparing. We will also be developing our foundation understanding of letters and sounds, following the scheme of Twinkl Phonics.

Reading

For the first four weeks, your child will bring home a book from our library, each Friday, to share with you. We ask that you read and share this book together. Once we have started the teaching of phonics, your child will bring a Twinkl phonics book home each week. The book will remain the same across the week and will be changed every **Friday**. This book will match your child's current reading level. Please share this book with your child as often as you can. Whilst your child is learning the new sounds, it is helpful to encourage the children to use the pictures to tell stories.

Please log any reading on their **Boom Reader** account so that we can stay informed about their home learning. This can be a positive or helpful comment regarding their strengths or difficulties. Boom Reader accounts are currently being set up and you will be contacted to log in once this has been finalised.

It is essential that these reading books are in your child's bookbag each day as we will also be reading them during school.

Twinkl Phonics	Each Friday, an outline of the focus sounds and words will be shared with you. It would be useful to support the children in identifying any sounds and tricky words when reading with them at home.	
	If you need support in knowing the letter sounds, please contact me.	
Maths	We will be using CBeebies Number Blocks to help with our teaching of numbers, as well as following a White Rose scheme. We will be starting with '1' and then taking a different number every week to understand the value and embed foundations. Other maths activities will be taking place at the same time. This is part of the recommendations from the Maths Mastery approach.	

Quick Reminders

- Please can you make sure your child brings in a named coat, water bottle and their book bag each day. Please label any additional belongings such as uniform or winter clothing.
- Please provide a **full change of clothes** in a named plastic bag.
- PE will be on a Monday and Wednesday and children can come into school with their PE kits on.
