Class News

Rabbits

We have had SUCH a fun week in Rabbit Class! We have been learning all about birthdays!!! We learnt about traditional birthday celebrations in our country and around the world. In literacy, we have been writing birthday invitations to our dream party and also designing and writing a birthday card for Billie Bear. All week, the children have been creating and making their own gifts for Billie and thinking of amazing and imaginative gift ideas! In maths we have been recapping the composition of numbers 4 and 5. This week has been our first week of Level 3 phonics and I have been super impressed at how hard the children have worked, learning the new sounds. Our week finished in the best way with a BIRTHDAY PARTY for Billie Bear on Friday afternoon. We danced and sang to traditional party songs, played party games and even had cupcakes. Happy Birthday Billie Bear! Have a lovely weekend!

<u>Hedgehogs</u>

We have had another very busy week in Hedgehog Class - full of so much learning and fun! In English we are continuing to learn through the text 'Beegu' by Alexis deacon. This week we have found out about contractions, where two words are joined together with an apostrophe to make a new word e.g. I am becomes I'm. We have also been learning about the prefix of 'un' for example - 'unhappy' 'uncomfortable' to use in descriptive writing. We are very excited to create our own postcard next week as if we are Beegu and we would like to stay on Earth for a holiday! In maths we are continuing our learning about 2D and 3D shapes. We have found out what lines of symmetry are, as well as how to count faces and edges of 3D shapes. In Science our garlic bulb has finally grown some roots and shoots and our cress seeds are doing some very interesting things. the cress in the pretend oven has grown so much in the dark - but it is yellow. We are observing closely to see if our predictions are correct. Our super-duper Nativity is coming along so well...we can't wait to show you!

Foxes

We are on the countdown to Christmas! What a week we have had. We have done lots of times table work in maths, recalling our 9, 7, and 11 times tables. In science we looked at the different sizes of shadows depending on the distance and direction of light. We also had a fun shadow puppet show in science where we got to make little performances in groups. In English we have been gathering facts that we are planning to put in our non-chronological Horrible Histories reports. In art, Foxes finished their Tudor portraits with Mrs Denton which all look absolutely INCREDIBLE! In computing Foxes worked in pairs to create an animation on scratch. We learnt how to create a conversation between two sprites and how to change the backdrop. In history we looked at portraits of Queen Elizabeth and discussed whether she would or wouldn't have liked these portraits. In French we learnt the words for different colours and will continue to practice these. Have a fantastic weekend!

Badgers

We have worked like troopers this week, absolutely bossing our assessments! It is great to see that all their dedicated learning is paying off. In science, we created our own periscopes, angling mirrors correctly so that we could see over the tops of tables - and the funny faces some children were making! In PSHE, we thought about the 'ingredients' needed to create a friendship recipe. In RE, we researched different Christian organisations and how they help others, presenting it in different ways. In geography, we explored the physical features of Europe, including mountains, rivers and glaciers, which we then marked on a map. In maths, we have been adding fractions with different denominators, converting to enable us to do this. In PE, the children have continued to develop their gymnastics skills. With Miss Dorsett, they worked on more challenging partner balances, showing some great strength and determination. In Friday PE, we started exploring rhythmic gymnastics, experimenting with balls, hoops and beanbags. Forest School was fab, even though a few of us did slightly misjudge the depth of the stream...have a great weekend!


