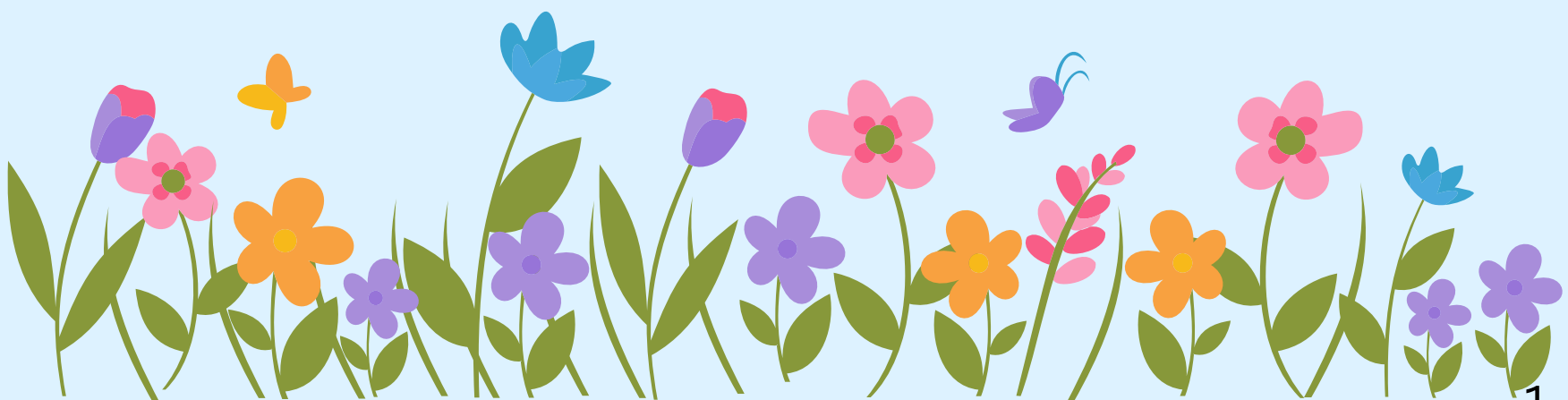

This week in Rabbit Class we have been continuing to learn about castles, knights and dragons. We listened to 'Zog' and thought about why Zog deserved a golden badge. We then wrote a certificate congratulating him on something we thought he did well, using our phonics knowledge to support our writing. This supported our PSED learning, congratulating other peoples' successes. I am amazed at how hard all of the children have been working on their writing, as it is improving by the day. Keep it up team Rabbits! In maths, we have been working on number bonds to ten, in 2 and 3 parts and recapping doubles to 10. We designed our own shields, made royal jewellery and decorated crowns. Hedgehogs have been having a fantastic time expanding our knowledge of the Titanic, practising our neat handwriting, learning about the properties of materials and composing our own pieces of music using picture notations.

We are roaring along with our reading and I am so impressed with our phonics and writing skills in our class, and the confident way in which we apply these to all our work.

We enjoyed making pop up cards for the Easter fair and concentrated so well on the process and being careful when cutting and sticking to make wonderful cards. Pop along to our stall tomorrow to see what we have done!

I can't believe that there is only one week to go! Fox class have been brilliant this week and really engaged. They have particularly enjoyed learning about the different Roman Gods and writing about them in different ways in English (using adverbs, verbs, including apostrophes etc.). In maths Fox class have been working hard with learning about mass and capacity. We have also been busy doing our arithmetic and reasoning tests! In science we have been doing an investigation to with stems. We put food colouring in water and we are trying to see whether the stem will absorb the colour from the water and change the colour of the petals. In PE we have continued to develop our skills in tennis. In computing we have been designing our websites in pairs, they all look so amazing and have turned out great. I hope everyone has a lovely weekend!

Badgers



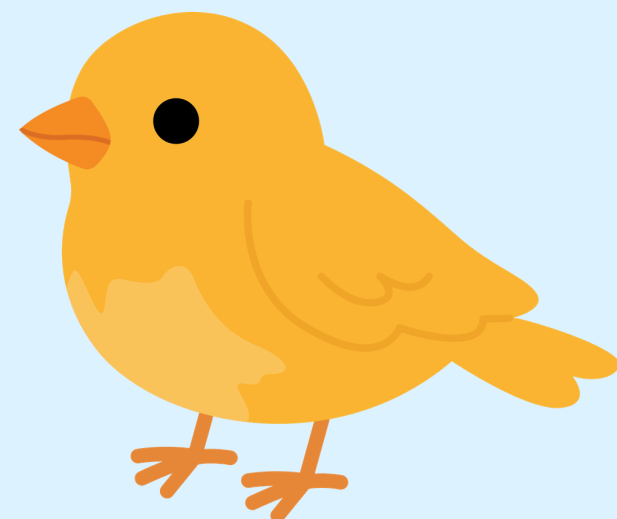
After an unbelievably busy time last week (I'm still recovering!), we have all been trying to settle back into normality! In English, we have continued with our biographies on influential Black and British figures. In maths, we have continued looking at percentages, converting between decimals, fractions and percentages and finding a percentage of an amount. In history, we learnt about the struggles and successes during the 70s and 80s for those who were Black and British, including the beginning of Notting Hill Carnival. In RE, we learnt about the different holy days that lead up to Easter. In Science, we conducted an experiment to discover how adding more batteries into a circuit affects the brightness of a bulb. In PSHE, we looked at the difference between voluntary and paid jobs and identified those around us. We also got creative, making and decorating our origami crowns to be sold at the Easter Fair!

Badgers got out in the sunshine this week, made their own bow and arrows and made garlic bread on an open fire, which was quite spicy we we told!

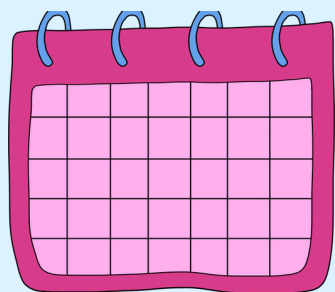


Billie Bear's Adventures

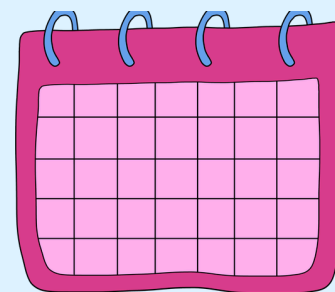


Billie bear went home last weekend with another child from Rabbits- looks like he had a lovely time at the park!

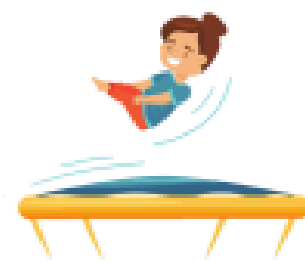
