This week in Rabbit Class we read 'What the Ladybird Heard at the Seaside'. We played some beach sounds, closed our eyes and thought about our senses and what we could hear, smell, see, touch and taste. In literacy, we designed a wanted poster for either Lankey Len or Hefty Hugh in the story, using adjectives and as independently as possible. We worked on pattern in maths and continued to consolidate our tricky words and read/write polysyllabic words in phonics. After finishing our layers of the ocean paintings last week, we added different fish to them that you would find at those depths. We also created beautiful under the sea silhouette paintings using cotton wool balls to dab different shades of blue and black. Finally, what a wonderful first Sports Day for Rabbits! Well done everybody! Great job!

This week Hedgehogs have been working hard on their castle leaflets which we will display in the entrance corridor for everyone to have a look at!
