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# 'Meerkat Mail' Chestnuts Class Newsletter Term 4 2023




Dear Parents and Carers,



This term we will be starting our new topic 'Meerkat Mail'. We will be exploring all things to do with animals and comparing them to humans. Some of the key texts we will be using for our learning are:







### **Questions to ask at home:**

Can you remember the continent song?

What ocean surrounds the UK?

What is a mammal?

Which animals can you name that are fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals?

Can you discuss differences between animals and humans?

What is a spreadsheet used for? Can you make one on your computer at home?

Can you recall the Easter story?

#### **Encouraged (but not mandatory) Home Learning Tasks:**

Make a map of the world using different resources – paint, playdoh, drawing, Lego, collage

Compare the seasons and the changes that you see happening outside


Make an Easter inspired craft

Make an animal from recycled materials

Measure things around your home – using a table to record your results

The learning map attached to this newsletter outlines the areas we will be learning about and some of the work we will be doing in teacher-focused activities and group work.

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## **Home Learning**

Reading	Please read at least 3 times a week and record this in your child's yellow reading record.
Phonics Year 1 (and some year 2)	Children in year one will carry out a phonics screening check (set by the government) in June 2023. The 'pass mark' for this screening is 32 out of 40. Any children who do not achieve the 32 will need to take it again in year two. Please ensure you are doing everything you can to support your child with their phonics. Little Wandle home learning packs are available online for roughly £5, but there is also a wealth of free support on YouTube. The BBC also offer many free phonics games on their website.
Maths	By the time children leave Key Stage One (i.e. Year 2) they should ideally be fluent in their 2, 5 and 10 times tables. Building this fluency will aid children as they progress through to Key Stage 2, notably in aspects such as telling the time. It would be great if you could help your child practice these times tables to support their learning.
