Dear Families,



Home Learning

Reading/phonics is the predominant homework in KS1.

Please read with your child **at least three times a week**, even if it is just for 5 minutes. When reading with your child, please acknowledge the fact that the book has been read by **signing and dating in the reading record book**. The reading record book is for home reading only. We will check these every Friday

We have **different** record keeping at school where we record when we have read together along with the next steps forward. .

During reading sessions, please discuss the story with your child and ask them questions about what they are reading. These questions will help to develop their understanding of what they are reading as comprehension and discussion are key reading skills in Year 1 and 2.

Now we are coming in via the playground, the pupils have been given the responsibility of changing their books, as they come through the library, when they need to. It is recommended that they read the book three times (unless they are purple shelf or above) to read it for fluency and understanding. This will build confidence in reading and ensure they are using ALL reading skills, not just sounding and blending.

At school, pupils read 2-5 times a week either in a group or individually, focusing on key skills of sounding out and blending, fluency and understanding. This is timetabled within our English time, so rest assured they are being read with, even though it is not recorded in the diary.

Spellings and homework

Every week, an overview of the phonics being taught will be sent home. This will outline the phonemes and graphemes we have taught. Please practice these with your child. There is no expectation to hand this in- this is for practise and reference only. The pupils take this on Friday morning and are expected to place them in their bag when asked. If it isn't in the book bag, please feel free to request one incase it has been lost en-route. I have attached all sheets for the term to ensure you have them for reference just in case.
