
'Off We Go!'


Reception Newsletter - Term 3


Dear Parents.

Welcome back and we hope you all had a lovely Christmas holiday. Our topic is 'Off We Go!' where we will be learning about different types of transport and the journeys that they can take us on. We will also be looking closely at how transport such as cars, buses and planes have changed since they were first invented. In addition, we will be looking at the emergency services and what each one does to help us and the local community. We will also be exploring Chinese New Year.

Key Texts







Literacy: Our focus in literacy this term is to secure our phonic knowledge to write words, sentences, instructions, letters and stories through talk for writing. In reading, our phonics knowledge, high frequency and tricky words will develop further from our reading of key texts and sharing and discussing new stories together. The fiction texts we will be looking at are 'The Naughty Bus' and 'Whatever Next!' We will also be exploring some non- fiction books to find out about people who help us and vehicles.

Maths: We will be continuing to secure our number skills by learning number bonds and then exploring addition and subtraction with games and activities. We will be looking at data handling by counting vehicles. We will continue to explore money through our play.

The main part of the topic is to use the vocabulary associated with all different types of vehicles and jobs and how they are different and the same. We will also be looking at maps to see where different countries and cities are and how we might get there.

Home Learning

Thanks to constant practice, the children's reading is developing well. Thank you to all of you who support this at home. It really does make a difference.

Reading Please read with your child regularly, even if it is just for a few minutes. Please focus on blending sounds together and focusing on reading the high frequency words and tricky words. We will be checking the books to see how much reading the children are doing at home. This will take place every Monday. The children should be reading a minimum of 3 times a week.

Little Wandle	Home learning books will continue to come home with tasks for you to work together on. Please use the books to complete these and then bring them in weekly.
Word reading	We want to help the children with their frequency of word reading. We therefore are going to start sending home words for the children to be able to sight read. We will check these weekly and when they have read them automatically 2 weeks in a row they will move up to the next set of words. You will find these stuck into their Home Learning Books.
Maths	To help consolidate the children's counting. Please spend time counting objects around the house one to one with confidence to 10 and their knowledge of 1 more and 1 less
