





Term 5 Newsletter 'Who benefits from Conservation?'

Dear Parents,

We hope you have had a lovely Easter break! This term, our topic is 'Who benefits from Conservation?' and the children will be exploring National Parks locally and Yellowstone in the USA. We will be developing our written work, editing and refining our grammar skills. There will be a clear focus on grammar gaps on a weekly basis delivered 3 times a week. We will be using our persuasion techniques and speech writing and looking at important issues effecting the planet. We will be developing our reading comprehension skills through short texts, covering the genres of fiction, non-fiction and poetry.

Reading	Please read with your child at least three times a week at home and ensure it is signed and dated. A member of staff will be checking reading diaries on a Friday.		
Spellings	Spelling tests are every Tuesday and your child will be tested on the spelling pattern they had learnt about the previous week.		
Maths	Year 5 and 6 Maths homework will be set on a Tuesday and will be expected to have been completed by the following Monday. Maths pages will be chosen by the class teacher.		
Times Tables	Children will learn their tables and practise these in school at least twice a week. Each child has a Times Table Rockstars login and should be practising their tables (either on this website or in another way) three times a week at home.		
Grammar	Year 5 and Year 6 Grammar homework will be set on a Tuesday and will be expected to have been completed by the following Monday.
