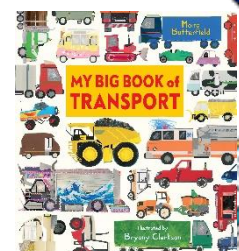
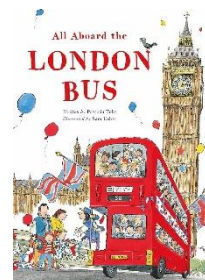
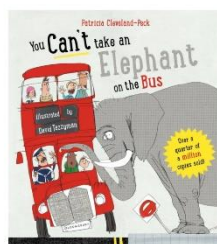
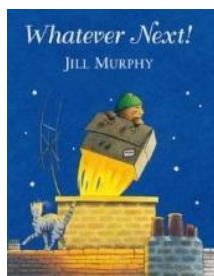
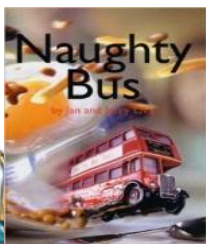
Dear Parents,

Thank you for all your support throughout the autumn terms. The children have settled into school life, made so much progress already and have really established themselves within the school community.

Our next topic is '**Off We Go!**' where we will be learning about different types of transport and the journeys that they can take us on. We will also be looking closely at how transport such as cars, buses and planes have changed since they were first invented. We will also be looking at how transport is used in the emergency services to help the local community and us - we have arranged a visit from Sussex Police to show us their equipment, vehicles and to discuss all that they do. Additionally, we are hoping to take a trip to Uckfield Fire Station, and information surrounding this trip will follow when we have a confirmed date.

Key Texts






Literacy:

Our focus in literacy this term is to secure our phonic knowledge as well as introducing the new phase 3 digraphs. We will be using these to write words, letters, instructions, and stories. Our phonic and tricky word knowledge will help us to read key texts, share and discuss new stories.

The main part of the topic is to use the vocabulary associated with all different types of vehicles and jobs. We will also be looking at maps to see where different countries and cities are and how we might get there.

Maths:



We will be continuing to secure our number skills by learning number bonds within 0-5 and learning about the numbers 6, 7 and 8. We will be looking at data handling by counting vehicles. We will begin to explore measurement including capacity, mass, length, height, and time.

Super Home Challenges!

You might like to choose one of the following activities to try with your child at home. You can bring these into school whenever they are finished to share with the class.

- Go on a journey, take photos of how you got there and tell us about what you saw.
- Make a model of a new vehicle and give it a name. Be as creative as you can.
- Make a story about one of your vehicles at home that has been getting into trouble like the naughty bus. You could take photos to tell the story.
- Measure/weigh different things around your home using different measurement tools and scales.



Home Learning

Thanks to constant practice, the children's reading is developing well.

Thank you to all of you who support this at home. It really does make a difference. Please ensure you are reading with your child at **least 3 times a week** and adding these reads to Boom Reader.

Reading	Please read with your child regularly, even if it is just for a few minutes. Please focus on blending sounds together and focusing on recognising tricky words. When your child is reading if you can encourage them to sound out the words in their head and then say the word aloud.
Little Wandle	Reading books will continue to come home. Please see the inside page of the book for ideas, questions and comprehension prompts to discuss with your child.
Maths	To help consolidating the children's counting, please spend time counting objects around the house (and out and about!) with confidence to 10.

Quick Reminders

- Please can you make sure your child brings in a **coat, water bottle, their book bag and reading folder each day.**
- Our PE days are Monday and Friday. Please make sure your child arrives at school on these days already dressed for PE.
- Please can all children have a spare set of underwear and socks in their bag in case of any accidents. It is much more comforting for children to have their own change of clothes to put on if the need arises.
