

<u>'Contrasting Continents'</u> <u>Beech Class Newsletter</u> <u>Term 4 2025</u>




Dear Chestnuts Families,

Questions to ask at home:


What are the five oceans?

Home Learning Tasks

You could have a go at some of these at home:

- Make a map of the world using different resources paint, playdoh, drawing, Lego
- Compare the seasons and the changes that see happening
- Make an Easter craft
- Make an animal from recyclable materials
- Measure things around your home using a table to record your results
- Explore an Atlas

The learning map attached to this newsletter outlines the areas we will be learning about and some of the work we will be doing in teacher-focused activities and group work.



Home learning:

Please read with your child at least three times a week, even if it is just for 5 minutes.
When reading with your child, please acknowledge you have read by recording this on
Boom Reader. If you are having trouble with this, please ask for help.
During reading sessions, please discuss the story with your child and ask them questions about what they are reading. These questions will help to develop their understanding of
what they are reading. They will come home with a new reading book every Friday and can also bring a library book home if they wish!
Each week a phonics home learning sheet will come home. This will show you the learning we will be covering in the week. Your child could read this as part of their weekly reading.
Continue to practise the fluency facts. We are focusing on doubles and near doubles this term.
ie.5+5=10 is the double so use this to help with 5+6= 11 (one more)
The spelling rules and patterns we will be learning about this term are:
Adding the suffixes '-ing' and '-ed' Words with the trigraphs 'ear' and 'air' Words with the 'tch' trigraph Adding '-s' or '-es' to make plurals Why do some words end 'ge' or 'dge'? Why can /j/ be spelled 'j' or 'g' in different words? The 'W special' How do 'w' and 'qu' change the sounds that 'a', 'ar' and 'or' make in some words?


