
'Why does change happen?' Year 1 and 2 Newsletter Term 1 2025-2026

Dear Chestnut Families,


Welcome back. We hope everybody had a fun and relaxing summer. We are really looking forward to starting our new topic. This term we will be exploring,

Home learning:

Please read with your child at least three times a week , even if it is just for 5 minutes. When reading with your child, please acknowledge the fact that the book has been read by recording this on Boom Reader .
If your child is developing their reading, please include any books that you read together too! 'Reading' is not just them reading to you, but sharing and discussing stories. Children are encouraged to take books from our book corner home to facilitate this.
During reading sessions, please discuss the story with your child and ask them questions about what they are reading. These questions will help to develop their understanding of what they are reading as comprehension and discussion are key reading skills in Year 1 and 2. Chestnuts are encouraged to change their books regularly, please can you help remind your child when their books need changing as they go into school.
Year 2 will be given a Lexia Login to support their reading. This can also be accessed at home There will be a short workshop after school (date TBC) in the coming weeks, to give an overview of how reading will work in Chestnuts class.
Attached to the newsletter you will find our Weekly Phonics overview- please read through these words with your child at home to supplement the Phonics teaching we will be completing in class.
We will not be setting weekly Spellings for testing. Spellings to practice will be sent home when required or a new word or spelling pattern has been learned.
For Maths homework please practise the key 'fluency facts' attached to this letter. The faster they can recall these, the easier maths sessions will be.

Helping to enrich our topics

It is always great to have items that support our topic, so if anyone has any items that may help us with any of the work above that we could borrow, we would love to see them. We will have a **topic-based** 'show and tell' weekly on a Friday, see below the slot for your child. Please make sure all items are linked to the topic or are an achievement from out of school (e.g. medal for a competition, attendance at swimming gala etc.)

PE days are Monday and Friday


Please ensure children have a water bottle in school daily and suncream applied on warmer days- we still try to spend as much time outside as possible in the autumn term!






