Wonderful Willow Class



An exciting time awaits us in Willow as we journey back in time and encounter the Rampaging Romans! We will be exploring Roman army life, understanding why the Roman roads were so straight and where they led to and with the help of Google maps, even explore some famous roman cities. We will be looking at the world map and seeing where invasions occurred at the height of the Roman's power globally. This topic will continue into term 2 where we will look more closely at the life of the Roman citizens across the conquered world. In science in terms 1 and 2 we will be looking at Forces and magnets, but linking with our Design Technology by understanding gears and

CAM mechanisms. Art and Design lessons will let allow us to create Roman shields in which we can use drama to enact battle formations adopted by the Roman armies. We'll immerse ourselves in songs, role play and hot seating whilst learning how to write stories, diaries and letters as though characters from the past.

All this and learning about place value and roman numerals to aid our addition and subtraction. Our Monster Maths challenges will embed our times table knowledge as well as the inverse division facts – all in a fun, exciting and rampaging romp through history.

In Lilac class this term we are exploring Britain since 1945. In English, we will be focusing our work around *The Borrowers* by Mary Norton. First published in 1952, *The Borrowers* reveals what life was like for children in the Fifties, as well as adding a bit of magic and imagination to our classroom. In Science, we will be exploring the evolution of Electricity and investigate different circuit types. In Maths, there will be a focus on rounding and place value, moving into negative numbers and linear sequences. Music and Art will be based

on different culture movements whilst our Topic lessons will be spent learning about a new decade each week and establishing changes and trends over time.
