# Open the Book – Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> January

Every month the 'Open the Book' team from the church bring the Bible to life with a re-enactment of stories linked to our Christian values for the term. How wonderful to welcome the team into the school this week as they gave us all lots to think about in response to their story of Joseph. The children were thrilled to take part as actors and even camels!







## Mrs L Sanders - Lilac Class - Thursday 4th January



Due to the recent wet weather and high winds Lilac class had their Forest School session in the school grounds this week.

We learned about fire safety and how to start a fire with flint and steels.

The children experimented with using cotton wool, Vaseline, silver birch bark, char cloth and King Alfred's cake.

They showed great 'Growth Mindset' approaches to this and persevered with the task (it was extremely windy, so they had to work together to use their bodies to provide shelter), creating lots of small fires, so are ready to put this into practice next time we go to the woods!



Using the hazel they had cut last time, the children perfected their whittling skills, using the new amphitheatre in the playground, to continue to develop their arrows. They worked sensibly, safely and with increasing independence.





## Maple Class visit from a Fire fighter

On the playground we learned to roll out and roll up the fire hoses. We estimated how long they were and then measured them with our steps and feet.





The children all tried on the Fire fighters safety gear and raced each other to get ready first. Then Mrs Sanders had a race to get ready against Chris....the gloves were a bit tricky!





Then the children read a story about 'Frances the Firefly' and fire safety and then designed our own fire safety posters. What a great start to our topic! Thank you so much to Chris for his enthusiasm on our visit.

If you are in receipt of any of the following:

- o Income Support
- o Income-based <u>Jobseekers Allowance</u>
- Income-related <u>Employment and Support</u> Allowance
- Support under <u>Part VI of the Immigration and</u> Asylum Act 1999
- The Guaranteed element of State <u>Pension</u> <u>Credit</u>
- Child Tax Credit only, if your annual household income (assessed by HM Revenue & Customs) isn't over £16,190. Anyone getting Credit won't get free meals regardless of income
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- o Universal Credit

You could help the school to receive extra funding (even if your child is in Reception or Ks1 and receives free school meals already, or doesn't even take up school meals). Please consider if you might be one of these families and if so register using the East Sussex website or the link below:

Parents also explained that it would be useful to have information about the reading bands and schemes used in the school. Mrs Norris will be writing to parents in the next school newsletter to clarify this.


