Homework at St Mary's we try to create a balance. Government guidelines puts the onus on schools to choose a framework themselves and we feel that for the following years, the amount of time spent on homework should be approximately:

Reception: half an hour per week

Year 1/2: one hour a week

Years 3/4: ninety minutes a week

Years 5/6: half hour each day

The best thing a parent can do for their child is to read to them, as evidence shows that families that read have better outcomes.





