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Reading Reward Scheme

Reading records are a great way of sharing what the children are reading at home and how long they are reading for - thank you for all your support in the minutes and comments that you detail in here. Reading Records are checked weekly in school by the class teacher or teaching assistant and minutes are counted for the class total.

For children in Maple, when an adult reads with them in school, they will also comment in the Reading Record. For KS1 and KS2, the teachers keep separate records when they read with a child in school, rather than comment in Reading Records. This ensures we always have access to the information (i.e. in school holidays or after school) to help with planning and assessment, and teachers can keep track of children who need may more regular reading.

British Citizen Award


As part of our fabulous British Values Day, we have launched the new British Citizen Award.



Each week we share a well being poster with you. This week's poster looks at why it is okay to talk about Mental Health.



Do you know someone who would be able to run a football club or sports club for KS1?


