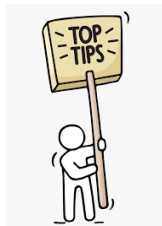

What does the symbol of a rainbow mean to you? Design your own rainbow and write in clouds words or phrases to help you remember what rainbows mean to you and to Christians.



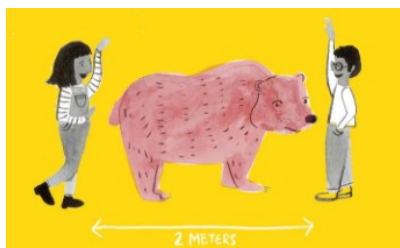
