The final session of Wildlife Explorers this summer was a survey of insects. Our surveys this year have helped inform policy and action via several national organisations requests for local information, such as RSPB, Plant Life and the Woodland Trust.

The explorers looked for different insects and the information could be put into the database record for buzzing, humming and droning flying insects on flowers.

In this last meeting of the club in July, the explorer's achievements were noted so that their end of year certificates could be awarded at the celebration assembly.

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### Summer Reading Challenge 2021

The Summer Reading Challenge is a national annual programme produced by The Reading Agency and delivered in partnership with libraries. This year's theme is *Wild World Heroes*.

The Challenge is to read 6 books over the summer holidays. For each book your child reads, there is a prize you can collect from the library. The challenge starts on the **17**<sup>th</sup> **July** and finishes on the **11**<sup>th</sup> **September**.

#### How to take part:

• You will need your library card and PIN

If you don't have a library card you can join the library online or in your library.

Sign up to the Challenge at www.eastsussex.gov.uk/src

- Visit your library to collect a reward (we'll ask to see your event sign up ticket)
- Borrow six library books to complete the Challenge. This can include eBooks, eAudiobooks and books on CD

• As you bring your books back let us know you're doing the Challenge so we can give you your prizes! **Can I join two children to Wild World Heroes using one library card?** No. Each child must have their own library card and PIN to sign up to the Challenge so that we know how many children take part. Your child can join online and we will post their card to you, or you can join them in the library.

**Can I use my adult membership card to sign my child up to Wild World Heroes?** No. your child will need their own library account to take part. Remember, there are no overdue charges and no reservation charges for children under 16 and there is no charge for lost or damaged books for children under 8, so it's worth them having their own membership! Your child can join online and we will post their card to you, or you can join them in the library.

I don't know my child's PIN You can reset your child's PIN online or by asking in the library.

• **My child can't read yet, can they still do the Challenge?** Yes! They can take part by sharing books with you or a friend, or by listening to CD audio books or e-audio books. You can also borrow multisensory stories from our Bag Books Collection if your child has learning disabilities. You can find out more about these here

• Why do you want to know what school my child goes to? We offer children the chance to have their certificate presented in school if they complete the Challenge so we need to know which school to send it to. Once we have sent out all the certificates we delete this information. We also visit as many schools as we can to tell children about the Challenge so it's useful for us to know how many children from each school take part. You do not have to give us this information if you prefer not to

• **My child is under 3. Can they sign up for the Challenge? They love books!** As some of the prizes for Wild World Heroes aren't suitable for children under 3 we have the Pre-School Wild World Heroes Challenge for them to do instead. Sign them up and we will give you a collector's card for stickers. When you've shared 6 books they will get a special medal sticker!
