

If you are bullied:-

DO:-

- Ask them to STOP if you can.
- Use eye contact and tell them to go away.
- Ignore them.
- Walk away.
- Talk to a friend.
- Try and look after yourself.
- **TELL SOMEONE.**



DON'T:-

- Do what they say.
- Get angry or look upset.
- Hit them.
- Think it's your fault.
- Hide it.



What should I do if I see someone else is being bullied?

- Tell an adult straight away.
- Don't try and get involved – you might end up getting hurt or you could end up in trouble yourself.
- Don't stay silent or the bullying will keep happening

The Head of School, the Governors and the staff will work together to:-

- Make our school a place where everyone can feel safe and happy. That means no bullying allowed.
- We will help everyone to get on with each other and we believe that everyone has the right to be who they are.

What will happen to a bully?

Teachers will get involved and help you solve problems. Bullies will be sanctioned alongside the school behaviour policy.

What is Bullying?

A bully is someone who hurts someone else by using behaviour which is meant to hurt, frighten or upset another person. This behaviour is repeated frequently.



Bullying can be.....

Emotional: being intentionally unfriendly, excluding, tormenting looks, spreading rumours.

Physical: hitting, kicking, taking or hiding belongings

Verbal: name calling, teasing, insulting, over speaking, writing or sending unkind notes or messages, including racism

Online: email and internet chat room misuse, mobile phone threats by text, calls, social websites.
