


Dear Parents,


The children have really enjoyed term 3 and learning about the Great Fire of London. We are sure you have learnt lots from your amazing children, and we have seen some of the wonderful work they have chosen to complete at home and brought in to share with their peers.

This term, we will be starting our new topic 'Meerkat Mail'. We will be exploring all things to do with animals and comparing them to humans, looking further into our continents, as well as oceans, exploring spreadsheets in computing and much, much more!

Some of the key texts we will be using for our learning are:







Questions to ask at home:

Can you remember the continent song? What ocean surrounds the UK?

What is a mammal?

Which animals can you name that are fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals? Can you discuss differences between animals and humans?

What is a spreadsheet used for? Can you make one on your computer at home? Can you recall the Easter story?

Home Learning Tasks

You could have a go at some of these at home:

- Make a map of the world using different resources paint, playdoh, drawing, Lego
- Compare the seasons and the changes that see happening
- Make an Easter craft
- Make an animal from recyclable materials
- Measure things around your home using a table to record your results

The learning map attached to this newsletter outlines the areas we will be learning about and some of the work we will be doing in teacher-focused activities and group work.

	sessions, please discuss the story with your child and ask them questions
	about what they are reading. These questions will help to develop their
	understanding of what they are reading as comprehension and
	discussion are key reading skills in Year 1 and 2. Children who are not
	reading Little Wandle books (Purple Band and above) can change their
Dlamia 0	reading books, within their book band, at any time from our class library.
Phonics & Spelling	Spellings or Phonics tasks will be given out each week and will be reviewed on Fridays. Please practise these words with your child at home.
	Please can children continue to learn their times tables at home. Year 1
Maths	children should be learning 10x, 2x and 5x tables. When secure with the
	2x, 5x and 10x tables, Year 2 children should be moving onto 3x and 4x
