We began the day by taking a photograph of our wonderful costumes! The children all took it in turns to talk about their costume to their friends at the front of the class.



Total time: 20 minutes

Serves: 4

4 teaspoons of tomato puree

1 chopped onion

1 handful of Tomatoes 85g thinly sliced chorizo 50g grated cheddar cheese 4 pieces of pitta bread

STEP 1

Heat your oven to 200C / 180C fan and get your baking tray ready, you can line it with baking paper if you like.

STEP 2

Spread each pitta with 1 teaspoon of tomato puree.

STEP 3

Add on your toppings! Bella likes to top her pitta pizza with tomatoes, chopped onion, chorizo and cheddar.

STEP 4

Place the pitta pizzas on a baking tray, get an adult to help place in the oven. Bake for 10 minutes, until the pittas go crispy and the cheese has melted. – Make sure you keep an eye on it so it doesn't burn!

STEP 5


If you like, scatter with basil and then serve.

Our Wildlife Explorers have continued their work on Mini-beasts, this week exploring the 'water-living' kind!






We look forward to seeing the children breaking the rules whilst raising money for our school charity. Look out for posters which will be going up around school from Monday 10th July.


National Schools Equestrian Association


