#### Forest School - Thursday 21st September



Maple Class were very excited to get outside and start exploring. Each were given a stick ready to go on a hunt for some autumn leaves. They then threaded as many leaves onto their sticks as they could, sharing what colours the leaves were as they picked them up "a yellow one" "a green leaf". They were really good at making sure to be

gentle so that the leaves did not tear.

They went up onto the playground to see if they could find any conkers, searching through the leaves on the ground. They found 11 conkers, just enough for one each! They spotted loads more up in the tree that had not fallen yet and we talked about how we would have to wait for the wind to blow them down!

Having explored the leaves and trees on the playground, the children headed back to the classroom where they made Ladybirds. We talked about all the different colours that a ladybird could be.

Once finished these were popped onto the end of the sticks so they could fly them around the classroom.

They also took it in turns to use a palm drill to make a hole through the conkers, threading them onto a pipe cleaner. With all 11 conkers on the pipe cleaner it created their conker

caterpillar. The children came up with some names for the caterpillar, but when put to the vote, Tilly was the most popular.

Maple Class finished their session with a story 'Goldilocks and the Three Crocodiles'.



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#### Wildlife Explorers

This week, our Wildlife Explorers have been investigating 'Wonderful Worms'.

They used the Opal citizen science activities, collecting earth worms from soil; measuring them and identifying them from ID sheets.

Our club members really showed their science skills: discovering most in our sample to be young compost worms.

There were some important facts to be learned by our Explorers:

- The two main worms that we find in our gardens are earthworms that live in the soil and tiger worms that live in the compost heap.
- Worms live where there is food, moisture, oxygen and a favourable temperature. If they don't have these things, they go somewhere else.
- Worms eat their own weight in organic waste, soil and minerals and excrete their own weight in castings daily, which makes compost and enriches the soil.
- They don't eat living plant tissue, so they don't hurt plants either. They truly are a gardener's best friend!
- Even though worms don't have eyes, they can sense light, especially at their anterior (front end). They move away from light and will become paralysed if exposed to light for too long (approximately one hour).
- Worms don't have legs but instead are covered in hairs or bristles that help them move.
- Worms breathe through their skin, which must remain moist to absorb oxygen from the air.
- If worms dry out they will die.
- Worms can have between 1 and 5 pairs of hearts, that's between 2 and 10 hearts.
- Worms suck in material with their lips as they have no teeth. Worms usually live for about 3-4 years and can live for up to 10 years.
- Earthworms sometimes appear to have a "belt" or "saddle" around their bodies; this structure contains cocoons inside which there are between 1-20 eggs.
- The cocoons, smaller than a grain of rice, are laid by the worms with the baby worms taking between 60 and 90 days hatch.



Our Explorers had a wonderful time digging through the soil and were extremely careful with the worms that they found.

He is also acting as a great ambassador for St Mary's as he has to arrive at each game in his school uniform.


