Wellbeing: Our aims are to fill the developmental gaps and increase wellbeing thereby increasing access to learning. This is facilitated by developing a supporting relationship with a trusted adult and offering experiences that allow the development of language to facilitate self-monitoring and regulation alongside social skills that will promote learning. We ensure that the way that the adult responds to the child facilitates the development of a good relationship where the adult is playful, accepting, curious and emphatic. In addition, Our staff use creative activities to access the side of the brain that came on line first when the gaps may have developed. The children are supported to recognise the sensations in their body, develop emotional vocabulary and recognise how these feelings are shown in others. We encourage them to think before making choices and acting, to know themselves and appreciate the special things about themselves.
