
Acceptable Use Agreement

Sports Awards


The PE specialty being covered this term is gymnastics and this week, Miss Ambrose awarded the following children Sports Awards:

They all looked brilliant!




Remembrance Service

Our roving reporter, Oliver, was also on the scene for our Remembrance Service and had this to say:

'Today all the children and teachers went in the church yard to join the mini remembrance service. We laid crosses, prayed and stayed silent for one minute to reflect on people who died during the war.

We recited a poem 'Poppy. Poppy''



The impact of the service stayed with Oliver overnight and the next morning he wrote:

'I am still thinking about those children of my age who lived during that war'



A Peek inside Maple Class - Remembrance

Maple Class began the week by learning about what is meant by Remembrance Day.

They looked at different photographs of war memorials and at maps of the areas that were most affected by fighting in England.

They talked about what women did during the war, as well as men.

Maple Class experimented with being quiet for two minutes whilst watching an animation of a field and the wildlife now there, which had been historically affected by bombing and fighting.



The children wanted to know what the poppy symbolised and they created their own poppies using a variety of different techniques.

Inspired by poppies and the poem 'What is Red' by Mary O'Neill, they then wrote there own version of the poem.

Red is a poppy; Red is blood
Red is a traffic light - stop!
Red is a post box; Red is paint
Red is fire, some bits of clothes, the inside of a poppy.
Red is a front door; Red is spots on our rug
Red is for cuts, for autumn leaves, a Ferrari.
Red is fireworks; Red is a tomato

Red is a raspberry, an ant and is lipstick.






Maple Class looked at photographs of the Remembrance Glade and talked about what it would feel like to stand within the glade and think of those that had died in the war.

On Wednesday, Rev Julie led a special Remembrance Service and each child and adult from St. Mary's 'planted' a cross in the church yard around the church memorial. Each cross had the name of someone who had died from the local area written on it, together with the date of their birth.

Maple Class then joined with the whole school, saying prayers together, and a poem about Remembrance,










Willow Class - Workshop






Positivity Board
