Focus on Online Safety

This week I want to share some thoughts about how best to support our children with using the internet and other technology safely. It is obviously a significant part of this generation's lives as they have only ever known a world with the internet, mobile phones and social media. Navigating this as a parent can be challenging! I am planning to hold an Online Safety Workshop for Parents (Thursday 11th January at 9am) with some practical support and guidance, but in the meantime wanted to start us thinking about this area of safeguarding as a whole school community.

We as educators and parents need to be preparing our children to be 'digitally resilient'. This means finding that balance in terms of their access to the internet; finding an age appropriate level with parental controls, rather than restricting all access, or being overly risk averse. This can lead to children being vulnerable due to lack of knowledge and possibly at risk when they do become digitally active.

School Value and Weekly reflection

Each term, we focus on a Christian Value with weekly reflection in assembly and in class.

We like to develop this further by asking you, where possible, to discuss the reflection of the week with your child(ren) at home.

This week, as part of anti-bullying week, the children have been following the story 'Mixed' by Arree Chung, which is a tale of overcoming, accepting and celebrating difference. Linking this to our value of Trust and how important trust is within any friendship or family, the children were then encouraged to write an acrostic poem using TRUST to demonstrate how they can show trust in someone.

Maybe as a family you can talk about how you show each other Trust and how this can be developed further. Perhaps you can develop your own poem, saying or phrase that will remind each of you about your family trust goals?

Anti-Bullying Week

The whole school took part in odd socks day on Monday to mark the start of Anti-bullying week, and in Assembly, they identified the difference places they could seek support if needed. In their spiritual journal activity, they designed odd socks and wrote acrostic poems about trust.

On Friday, Lilac Class watched a BBC Live Lesson, learning the difference between bullying and banter behaviours. They then discussed different useful phrases that could be used if a joke is getting uncomfortable.


