
Do you need a castle to conquer?

Some of the key texts we will be using for our learning are:








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School Trip

Reading	Please read with your child at least three times a week . When reading with your child, please acknowledge the fact that the book has been read by <u>signing and dating in their</u> <u>reading record book</u> . Please make sure the reading record is in school daily.
Spellings and homework	Spellings will be given out at the start of the term as a spelling booklet. For Year 1sThese spellings are linked to the Little Wandle sounds that your child has been learning in their daily phonics lessons. For Year 2s these spellings are linked to the Little Wandle spelling patterns that your child has been learning in their spelling sessions.
Maths	Please continue to practise the 2, 5 and 10 times tables at home as much as possible. Your child will have a times table rockstar login to support with this.
