Headlines from our Head of School

Focus on 'International Links'

We are aiming for our children to not only think beyond themselves and their immediate lived experience, but as part of their courageous advocacy to head out into the world as people motivated to make positive change. To support this:

The children were excited to learn last week that we have been gifted the sponsorship of an adopted elephant named 'Toto'. In assembly, Mrs Perry and the pupil governors talked to the school about one of our parents and governors, John Black, sponsoring Toto for us as a school in order to support The Sheldrick Wildlife Trust. The children learned about conservation organisation, dedicated to the protection of wildlife and the preservation of habitats in East Africa.

The adoption will provide the opportunity for our children to learn more about conservation and explore a wide range of important issues. These include endangered habitats, threats to biodiversity, and the delicate balances in ecosystems as well as reflect on how people can support endeavours to fight for these causes and develop safe havens for wildlife.

With the aim for all our children to develop into global citizens with a personal commitment to social justice, next year will see the return of our school link with a school in Malawi.

Discussions are already underway, assemblies and workshops are planned for early September when the children will be re-introduced to Chris Knott and his work with the Starfish Malawi organisation. We are planning for the children to make meaningful links with school children in Malawi through regular FaceTime opportunities ,to challenge stereotypes, broaden their experience of the world and consider their place through shared projects. Our first will



focus on sharing stories that are important to us and hearing stories from the children in Malawi that matter to them.



School Uniform

Teachers have been noticing an increase in uniform 'variations' and we would request increased consideration of our school uniform policy.

Our policy is based on the belief that a school uniform:

- promotes a sense of pride in the school
- engenders a feeling of belonging is practical and distinctive
- identifies the children with the school
- makes children feel equal to one another in terms of appearance
- reflects the sense of community that the school takes pride in.

Expectation

There is a formal school uniform to which children are expected to adhere, and the co-operation of parents in maintaining the standard of dress is expected

 Only wristwatches and stud earrings are permitted and hair longer than shoulder length must be tied back.


- Earrings are required to be covered or removed for P.E. sessions.
- On health and safety grounds, no jewellery is to be worn at school.
- All sweatshirts or cardigans must have the school logo on them
- Shoes should be black
- Socks and tights should be plain grey, black or white.

Congratulations to our Year 3/4 football team who placed 3rd at an interschool football tournament this week.







Congratulations to Joshua who recently took his karate and went up to a blue belt.

The Briars

On 25th June 2024, Maple Class had a wonderful time at the Briars! They enjoyed pond dipping, walking to Pooh Bridge, looking for different plants, footprints and animals on route, and a walk through the woodland and the wildflower meadow. Mrs Rowberry began by explaining what sorts of animals, insects and pond creatures we were likely to see and the children were fascinated and excited to start.

The pond dipping was incredible! The children had small nets to dip into the pond and they were encouraged to gently shake their nets to release anything that they had found. They saw some amazing things, using microscopes to help them spot small details. They found newts (both an adult and a baby), mayfly and midge larvae, water boatmen, pond skaters, blood-worms and dragon fly larvae. The plants were also amazing with waterlilies and pond weed, as well as a whole host of other plants supporting the pond life.



On the walk to Pooh Bridge, the class spotted a wide array of plants and insects, as well as some gorgeous horses. The children worked hard to spot different

footprints in the mud and created some of their own. Once there, they wrote

some small notes for Pooh Bear and posted them in the box!

After collecting some little sticks, they had a game of 'Pooh Sticks' throwing them over one side of the

bridge to see which one travelled the most quickly to the other.



It was then time for a special mini-beast peek turning over sections of big trees and discovering

lots and lots of wonderful mini-beasts! Maple Class learned about how careful they needed to be with all of the creatures and plants around them and they watched as the creatures tried hard to keep out of the light.

Setting off back through the woods, Mrs Rowberry had made some little traps to catch insects in and the children were able to see beetles and woodlice close up. In the meadow, they used nets to sweep along and see if they could find

any creatures in the long grass.



After a lovely picnic lunch, the class headed back to school. It was a long walk but they enjoyed listening out for the birds and spotting familiar things in the landscape. Happily, the children noticed the church spire from a long way away which helped them to find their way back to school!





Diocese of Chichester Leavers' Service






Positivity Board


