Focus on Social Justice Projects Celebrating MacMillan Coffee Event

It was so wonderful last week, to see so many of our wider community members coming to the MacMillan Coffee event organised and run by our Lovely Lilac class. The children prepared for the event by making cakes in school, writing letters to local community members, posting them by hand, creating posters and bunting and serving them tea, coffee and cakes with a smile. They **raised an amazing £509.06 plus 10 euros!** Well done Lilac Class and thank you to all who donated cakes.

Moving forward it is a key focus across the school, this academic year, for each class to engage with a social justice initiative - some local some global. The aim is to build on their 'love' for others by developing their 'fire' to fight for social justice beyond their own lived experiences.

Maple (EY) will be linking with the elderly in our community by visiting some of the regular village lunches, taking books to read and will be singing carols at Christmas as a way of tackling loneliness.

Cherry (Year 1/2) will be exploring the link we have with our adopted elephant Toto and the rescue centre that Mr Black has linked us with in Kenya.

Willow (Year 3/4) are working towards achieving the 'Better Planet Schools Award' by linking with our 'Wildlife Explorers' lunchtime club and Mrs Rowberry, and over the year will be learning more about 3 topics - biodiversity, sustainable farming and endangered animals.

Lilac (Year 5/6) are linking with Starfish Malawi organisation to make direct links with teachers and children in a school in Malawi called Mikute school. They will start by learning about each other and then plan to make tangible links such as story writing for each other and finding ways to support them based on what they feel would help.

Each class teacher will be writing to you with more information soon, as well as sharing ways that you as parents can support these class endeavours!



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
Local News
