
































Reading	Please read with your child at least three times a week at home and ensure that you record this on Boom reader. A member of staff will be checking Boom reader on a Monday.
Maths	Maths homework will be set fortnightly on a Monday, and the page numbers will be sent home inside the CGP books.
Times Tables	Each child will have a Times Table Rock stars login and should be practising their tables (either on this website or in another way) three times a week. This is especially important for year 4's as this will help build up their fluency leading up the times table quiz later in the year.
Grammar	Instead of English or grammar homework being set the children will need to be doing LEXIA at home. This will also be due fortnightly on a Monday, there will not be specific tasks set instead an amount of time we need children actively using the program. The amount of minutes will be set by the programme.
<p>Questions you could ask your child about their learning this term:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - What dreams and goals do you have for the future? - How will you achieve those goals? - How can you overcome challenges? - How do your dreams and goals differ to those in other religions/countries? - Children could create a mood board of their dreams and goals for the future (we would love to see these!)
