Pupils as Leaders

At the start of a new year, there are many new beginnings including new roles. The children have been thinking about roles of responsibility across the school that they would like to apply for. Giving children responsibility helps to develop and nurture accountability and an awareness of the role that they play to make a difference and the impact they can create. Spirituality Day

Staying Positive—Sid—He showed AMAZING resilience when he was counting 'one more' in Maths—he never gave up, even when it was super tricky.



Autumn School Census Day and Change of Menu on 2nd and 3rd October

The Census is on Thursday 2nd October, and the various data collected by County is used to help determine how much funding the school gets in the next few months. One set of data collected is how many children eat a school dinner on Census day.

Therefore, the kitchen are swapping the food they serve on the 2nd and 3rd October, as 'Fish Friday' is very popular! Unfortunately, this swap cannot be reflected on ParentPay, so please note the following:

- if your child normally eats on both days, then no action is required as the <u>Friday food will be served on Thursday</u> and vice-versa
- If your child normally eats only on Friday (not Thurs) then book their lunch for Friday as normal
- If your child normally eats only on Thursday (not Fri), then book lunch for Thursday as normal
- If your child has a packed lunch on one of these days, remember to send it in on the 'other' day!

The kitchen will simply swap what they serve on these two days.
