Celebrating our learning in Term 1

As we come to the end of our first time, it is amazing to think the children have only been back at school for 7 weeks. We have had a brilliant first term full of so many activities. Spirituality Day, Cross Country, Forest School Sessions, Harvest Festival and this week a focus on healthy eating, with our fabulous healthy eating day on Tuesday.

There has been so much learning and the progress the children have made is brilliant to see across all subjects.

Here is a look into what each class have been learning this term...

Maple class have had a wonderful first half term at school full of fun, learning, and new experiences! A big highlight was Buddy Time and Healthy Eating Day. Forest School has been another favourite—exploring nature and discovering the outdoors. It's been a fantastic start to the year, and we can't wait to see what adventures next term brings! Getting to know the wonderful new Maple Class children and seeing them settle so quickly and make such nice connections with the children and staff at St Mary's. It has been wonderful watching the Lilac Class buddies cherish and relish their new role, offering genuine and much needed support to their new buddies in Maple Class. Enjoying the excellent new playground and all that is offering the children. We have been loving it! The children have been really enjoying and appreciating the new mixed provision sessions with Maple and Cherry-watching friendships blossom and grow, seeing the older children guide and support the younger children.

This term Cherry class (Year 1 and 2), has been immersed in exploring the range of materials that they can use to create marks. They have learned about the different effects materials such as charcoal, graphite and chalk make on paper and using them to create different qualities of tone. This is linked perfectly to English where we practically created a story scene using toys and learned to describe it with our impressive adjectives. After that, we applied our knowledge of mark making and tone to draw the objects as an illustration that helps to tell a story.

One of the highlights this term was seeing our Year 3 and 4 pupils design and create their own light boxes in DT, successfully following their plans from concept to completion and producing wonderful final products that showcased both their creativity and practical skills.



Lilac Class have really loved learning about World War Two. We have had some brilliant writing, focused around this topic. We have loved singing old war time songs as well as designing and making our very own air-raid shelters.

We hope all our families have a fantastic half term break and we look forward to seeing you all ready for new learning in November.




Star Skills

Listening—Ophelia—when I look around, you're always listening. You listen to lessons, your friends and your teachers. Thank you Ophelia!






Positivity Board

Forest School Term 1


For Maple class's first ever Forest School, they were joined by their Year 6 buddies on the school grounds. Teaming up with their buddy, we held a conker rolling competition to see who could get their conker all the way across the playground. They also enjoyed preparing and tasting some cinnamon apples— Maple children defiantly enjoyed the making more than the tasting!















As the classes have made their way along the Forest Way to Forest School, they have been looking up into the trees at all the changing autumn colours. The children in Maple class listed all the different colours they could see on their first ever journey to the woods, these are a few of the colour combinations they said?: "yellow and green", "brown with some red".

Once in the woods the children have been practising their fire lighting skills, using a flint and steel to create a spark to light a piece of cotton wool. With the fire roaring away, the classes were able to enjoy trying cinnamon apples that they prepared and cooked over a fire. These were a success ,with many of the children wanting seconds!

















Using conkers and some clay, the children got creative and made themselves a snail. They used clay to make the body of the snail and the conker was used as the shell. They then found two sticks that they used to push into the clay body as eyes. One class make so many snails that they lined them up along a long log.








