We want to celebrate attendance in school since we returned from half term. Currently our School's attendance for the past week is 97.1%. Across the Pioneer Federation we aim for attendance to be above 97%. 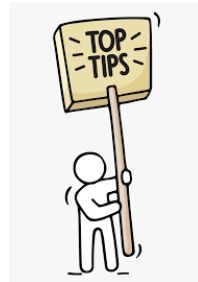

Caretaker – We are looking for a dedicated Caretaker to help keep our St Mary's site looking its best.

Previous experience of building maintenance / basic DIY and an understanding of health & safety regulations will be useful. Good interpersonal skills to protect the school's interests in dealing with contractors and other visitors to the site. Good literacy and numeracy skills are required.

Must be willing to undergo an Enhanced Disclosure & Barring Service (DBS) check prior to commencing work.

Wrap Around Care Play Worker - We are seeking to appoint an enthusiastic, self-motivated, friendly and creative After School Play Worker, ideally with experience working in schools, and a willingness to undertake Level 3 qualification in Childcare, Play-work or equivalent.

They will assist in the day to day organisation of the out of school clubs and assist in the provision of quality play opportunities.

Key tasks:

Provide safe, creative play opportunities, preparing activities, organising the programme etc.

Provide full care for the children. This may include providing refreshments.

Ensure that any injury or sickness of pupils is reported immediately to the First Aider or headteacher and the office. (Where appropriate, administer basic first aid and record all details in the first aid book.) To clean up after sickness of children

Mop up and wipe spillage from the floor surfaces or meal tables, and ensure that the eating area is left in a tidy condition.

Take part in the day to day administration, record keeping, ordering and purchasing materials and equipment.

Liaise closely with parents, school representatives and other childcare and play related agencies.

Individual Needs Assistant - We are seeking to appoint an enthusiastic, self-motivated and creative INA to join our supportive and friendly team, to assist with the implementation of an EHCP in support of a pupil with complex medical needs.

This position is to support SAL and medical needs and it is vital to fully read the job description and supporting documents before applying – these are available on the school website.

The candidate must be flexible, a good manager of time, able to keep good records and make keen observations in order to support next steps of learning. The successful candidate will be able to communicate effectively with pupils, staff and visiting professionals.
